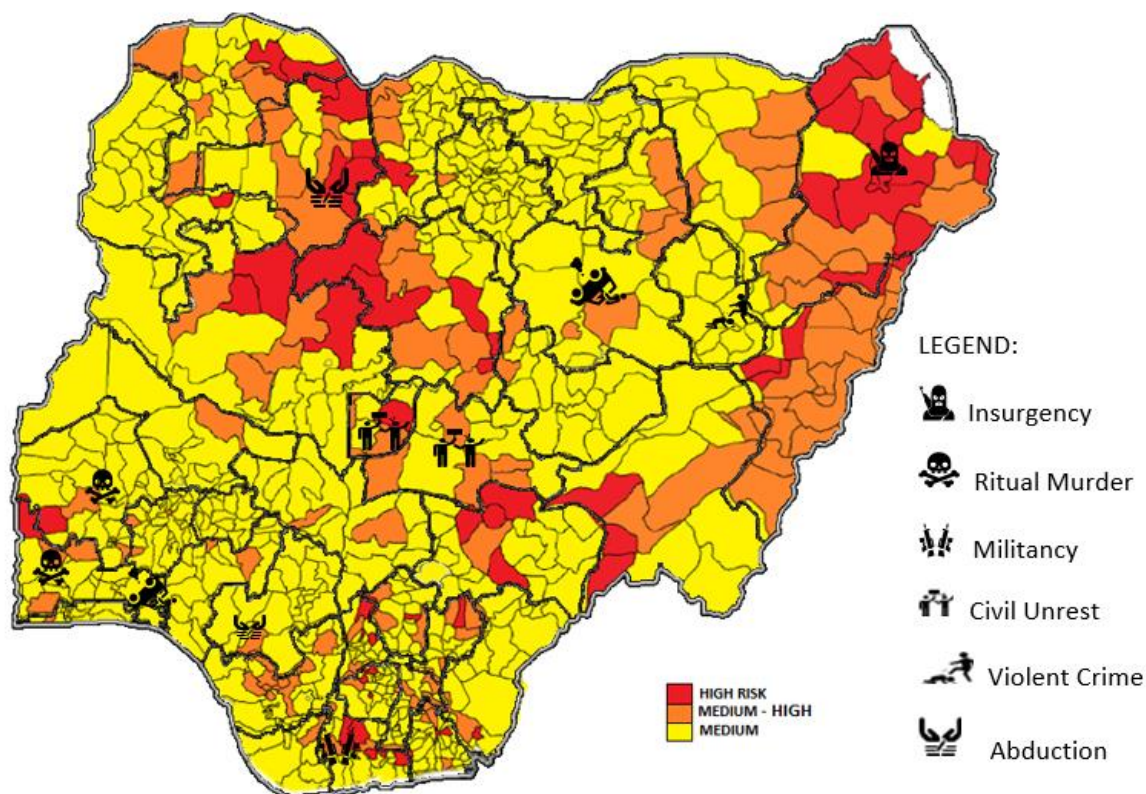

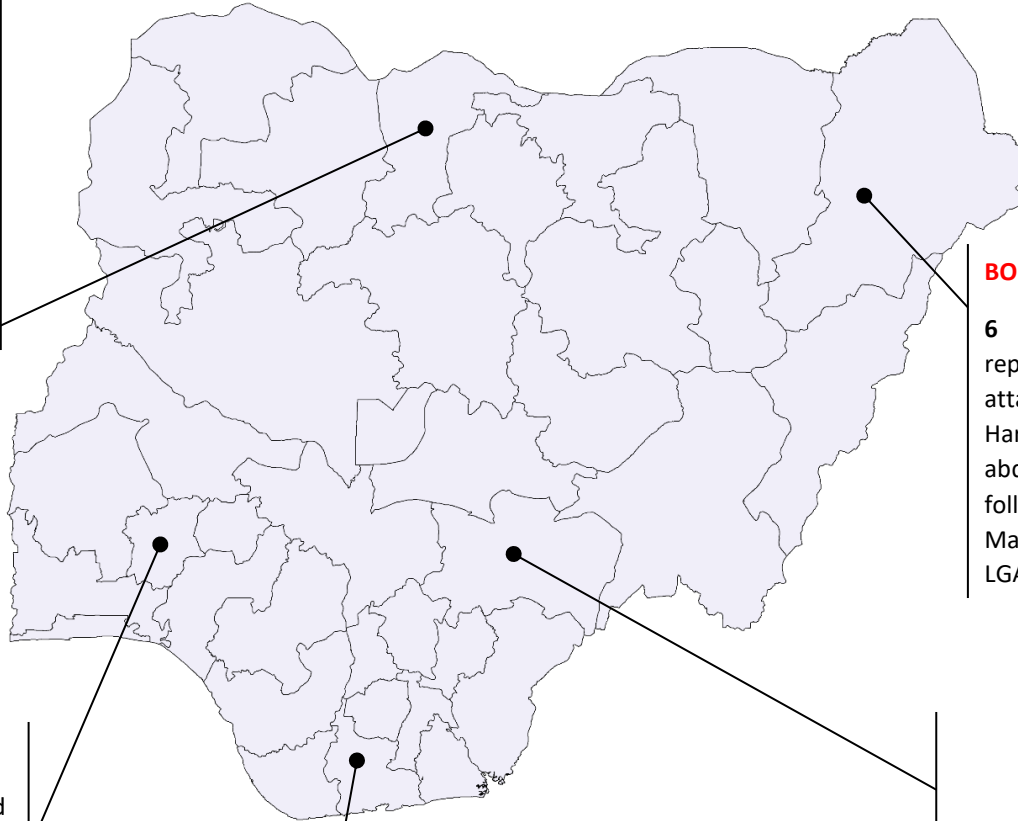

KATSINA

6 OCTOBER: Armed bandits reportedly attacked travelers along the Dayi-Tuge way in Malumfashi LGA, killing one, abducting several others, and stealing motorcycles.



BORNO

6 OCTOBER: GS forces reportedly repelled an attack by suspected Boko Haram terrorists who abducted three persons following an attack in Malari Village in Konduga LGA.

OSUN

6 OCTOBER: Suspected gunmen reportedly killed three persons while eight others were injured following an ambush on operatives of the Osun State Security Network Agency known as Amotekun in the Ile-Ife area of Ife North LGA.

RIVERS

6 OCTOBER: A fire outbreak was reported to have razed a section of the Rivers state government secretariat in Port Harcourt.

BENUE

6 OCTOBER: Five children were reported dead after a boat mishap in Obagaji community, Agatu LGA.

NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Nimet Forecasts 3 Days Thunderstorm, Heavy Rain Across Nigeria; Information Credibility- A2

The Nigerian Meteorological Agency (NiMet) has reportedly forecast thunderstorms and moderate to heavy rainfall across several parts of Nigeria from Monday to Wednesday, October 8, 2025, warning of possible flash floods in parts of the North and Central regions. The forecast was contained in NiMet's three-day weather outlook. According to the report, the rains will affect several states across the north, central, and southern regions of the country, with varying intensities.

MARITIME/OIL & GAS DEVELOPMENT

Nigeria's Oil Rigs Increase By 762.5 %; Information Credibility- A2

Nigeria's crude oil rigs have reportedly risen astronomically from eight to 69 in the past four years. The 762.5 percent leap, according to the Nigerian Upstream Petroleum Regulatory Commission (NUPRC), indicates renewed investor confidence in the nation's energy sector. NUPRC, in a statement highlighting its successes in the last four years, expects the number of rigs to increase in the coming months.

OPEC Agrees On 137,000 Barrels A Day Crude Output Hike For November; Information Credibility- A2

Key producer members of the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) have agreed to raise their collective output ceiling by 137,000 barrels per day (b/d) in November. "In view of a steady global economic outlook, and current healthy market fundamentals, as reflected in the low oil inventories, the eight participating countries decided to implement a production adjustment of 137,000 b/d from the 1.65 million b/d additional voluntary adjustments," the OPEC secretariat said. The decision comes as the group comprising Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Kuwait, Russia, the UAE, Algeria, Oman, and Kazakhstan began to unwind 1.65 million barrels per day (b/d) of voluntary cuts this month, starting with an initial 137,000 b/d increase in their collective production target.

Maritime Stakeholders Decry Nigeria's Shipbuilding Inability; Information Credibility- A2

Maritime experts reportedly stated that Nigeria currently lacks both the raw materials and the technical expertise necessary for shipbuilding. According to Ladi Olubowale, President of the African Shipowners Association (Nigeria), the country lacks the industrial capacity and skilled workforce required to construct ships locally. Olubowale explained that Nigeria lacks a shipyard capable of undertaking large-scale ship construction projects. Despite being Africa's most

populous nation and one of its largest economies, Nigeria continues to face significant structural challenges in developing a viable and competitive shipbuilding industry.

CRIME AND TERRORISM

Three Killed in Suspected Cult Attack at Atan-Ota, Ogun State; Information Credibility- A3

In the late hours of October 6, 2025, three persons were reportedly killed in a suspected cult related attack in Atan-Ota, an area of Ado-Odo/Ota Local Government Area of Ogun State.

Suspected Herders Attack Onoli Village in Enugu State, One Killed; Information Credibility- A3

On October 5, 2025, suspected herders reportedly attacked the Onoli village, Ugwuleshi Autonomous community in Awgu Local Government Area of Enugu State, leaving one dead.

GS Operatives Arrest Nine Suspected Cybercrime Syndicate Members in Yobe State; Information Credibility- A3

Government Security Operatives in Yobe State reportedly arrested nine suspected criminals who are notorious for using stolen mobile phones to gain authorised access to unsuspecting victims' bank accounts and perpetrate various Internet and ATM fraud schemes at Jerusalem Ward, Damaturu, Yobe State.

POLITICS

Political Leaders Urge Nigerian Government to Reform INEC Ahead of 2027 Elections; Information Credibility- A3

Some political leaders in the country have urged the Federal Government to fix the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) before the 2027 general elections to restore public trust and enhance electoral credibility. The leaders, including governors and former ministers, made the call on Monday, October 6, 2025, during a high-level panel discussion hosted by the Athena Centre for Policy and Leadership.

MACROECONOMICS

Naira Rally Strengthens As FX Speculation Declines; Information Credibility- A3

According to reports, Nigeria's naira is staging one of its most remarkable comebacks in years, buoyed by fresh reforms, rising foreign reserves, and a sharp drop in speculative activities in the foreign exchange market. Once battered by volatility, arbitrage opportunities, and widening gaps between official and parallel markets, the naira is now trading stronger across both ends of the market. At the parallel market, the naira has been exchanging at N1,460 to the dollar lately, while at the official window, it trades at N1,475/\$, its strongest performance this year. This narrowing

spread between the two markets reflects a growing alignment that analysts say underscores the impact of reforms introduced by the Central Bank of Nigeria.

INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

European Union (EU) Set To Introduce Fingerprint, Facial Scans At Borders; Information Credibility- A3

The European Union will introduce mandatory fingerprint and facial scans for non-EU travelers as part of its new Entry and Exit System (EES), beginning October 12, 2025. According to a statement, the rollout will start gradually at airports and land crossings before becoming fully operational on April 10, 2026, the European Commission said. The EES is an automated platform that records the movements of non-EU nationals on short stays each time they cross the external borders of participating European countries, including France, Spain, Iceland, Norway, and Switzerland. The commission stated that the system will apply to all non-EU nationals on short stays of up to 90 days within any 180 days.

Medical Helicopter Crashes On California Highway; Information Credibility- A3

According to reports, three people were in critical condition after a medical helicopter crashed onto a California highway on Monday. The aircraft crashed just after 7:00 pm (0200 GMT Tuesday) on eastbound Highway 50 in the state capital Sacramento, with flight-tracking data showing it had lifted off from UC Davis Medical Centre just minutes before. A pilot, a nurse, and a paramedic were on board and taken to the hospital after the crash in critical condition.

FIRE SAFETY ADVISORY

Following the recent trend in fire outbreaks across the country, there has been a rise in fire outbreaks due to higher temperatures, frequent use of electrical appliances, and dry weather conditions. Clients are urged to remain vigilant by:

- Ensuring all electrical equipment is switched off after use.
- Avoiding overloading of sockets and extension outlets.
- Storing flammable materials safely and away from ignition sources.
- Reporting faulty wiring, appliances, or unusual smells immediately.

FIRE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Electrical Safety

- Do not overload sockets or extension cables.
- Switch off and unplug appliances after use.
- Report damaged wiring or sparking outlets immediately.

Workplace Practices

- Keep corridors, stairways, and exits clear at all times.
- Store flammable materials in designated safe areas.
- Do not smoke in unauthorised areas.

Housekeeping

- Dispose of waste materials properly—avoid paper or debris piling up.
- Keep fire extinguishers and safety equipment accessible.

Emergency Preparedness

- Familiarise yourself with fire exits and evacuation routes.
- Know the location and use of fire extinguishers and alarms.
- Participate in safety drills and training sessions.

Personal Responsibility

- Stay alert for unusual smells (burning wires, gas, smoke).
- Report any unsafe practices immediately.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS & PRECAUTIONS**At Home**

- Inspect electrical wiring and appliances regularly; replace faulty or frayed cords.
- Always turn off irons, cookers, and heaters when not in use.
- Keep gas cylinders outside or in a well-ventilated area; check hoses and valves often.
- Store fuel, kerosene, and other flammables safely, away from heat sources.
- Never leave cooking unattended; keep a lid nearby for grease fires.
- Do not smoke indoors or near flammable materials.
- Keep matches and lighters away from children.
- Install and test smoke detectors monthly.
- Keep a fire extinguisher or sand bucket in accessible places.
- Teach family members emergency numbers and escape routes.

At Workplace

- Conduct routine safety inspections on wiring, sockets, and machines.
- Avoid overloading sockets or extension cords.
- Clearly mark and keep fire exits and escape routes unobstructed.
- Ensure fire alarms, extinguishers, and sprinklers are functional.
- Train staff on the PASS method of using extinguishers (Pull, Aim, Squeeze, Sweep).
- Keep flammable materials (paints, fuel, chemicals) in designated storage areas.
- Post “No Smoking” signs where necessary.
- Conduct fire drills at least twice a year.
- Keep first aid kits accessible and stocked.
- Encourage a safety-first culture — every worker is responsible for preventing fire risks.

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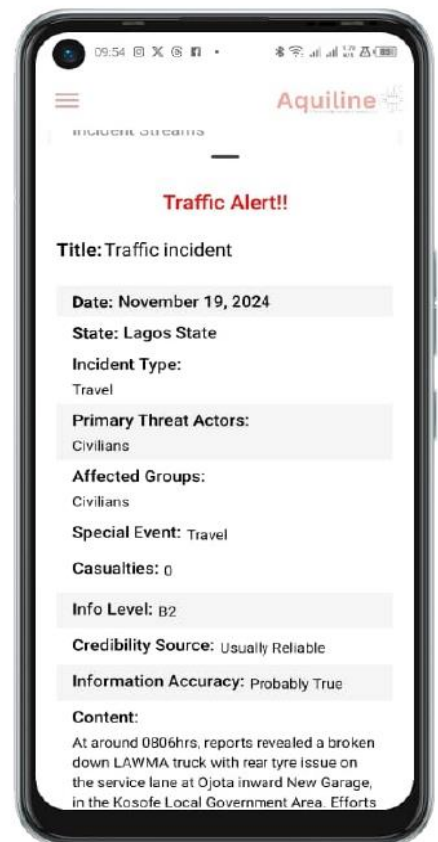
