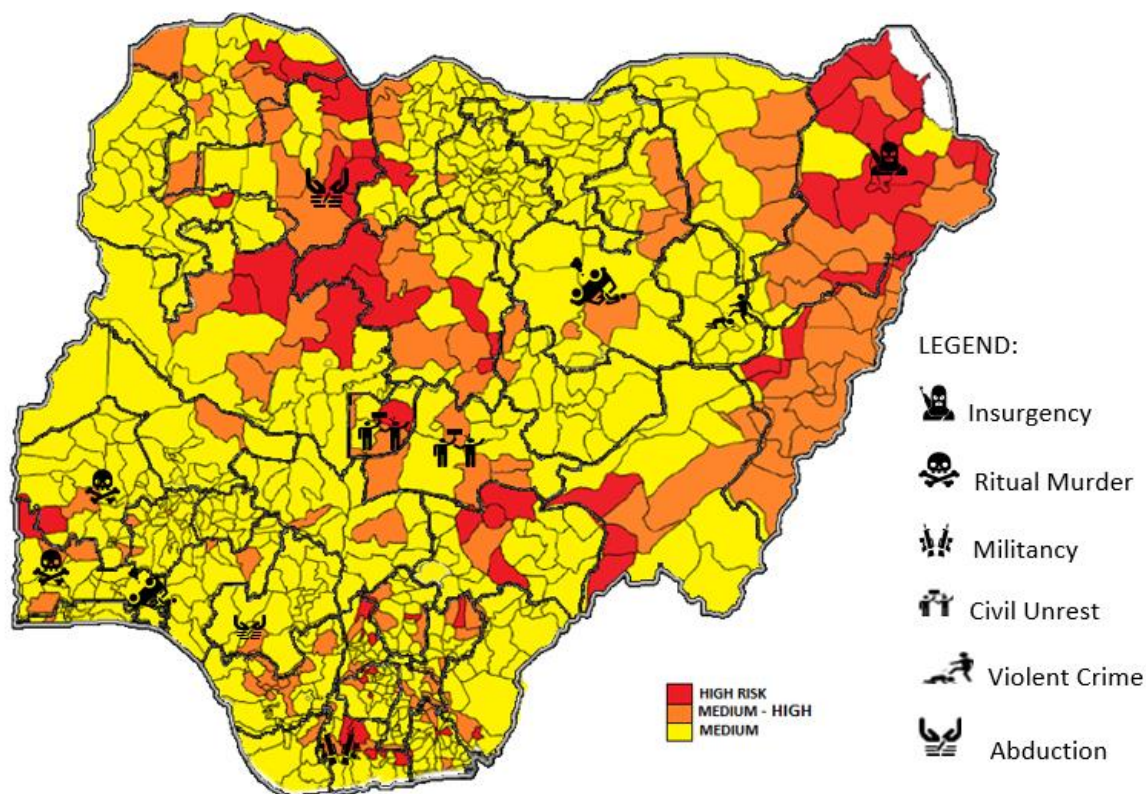

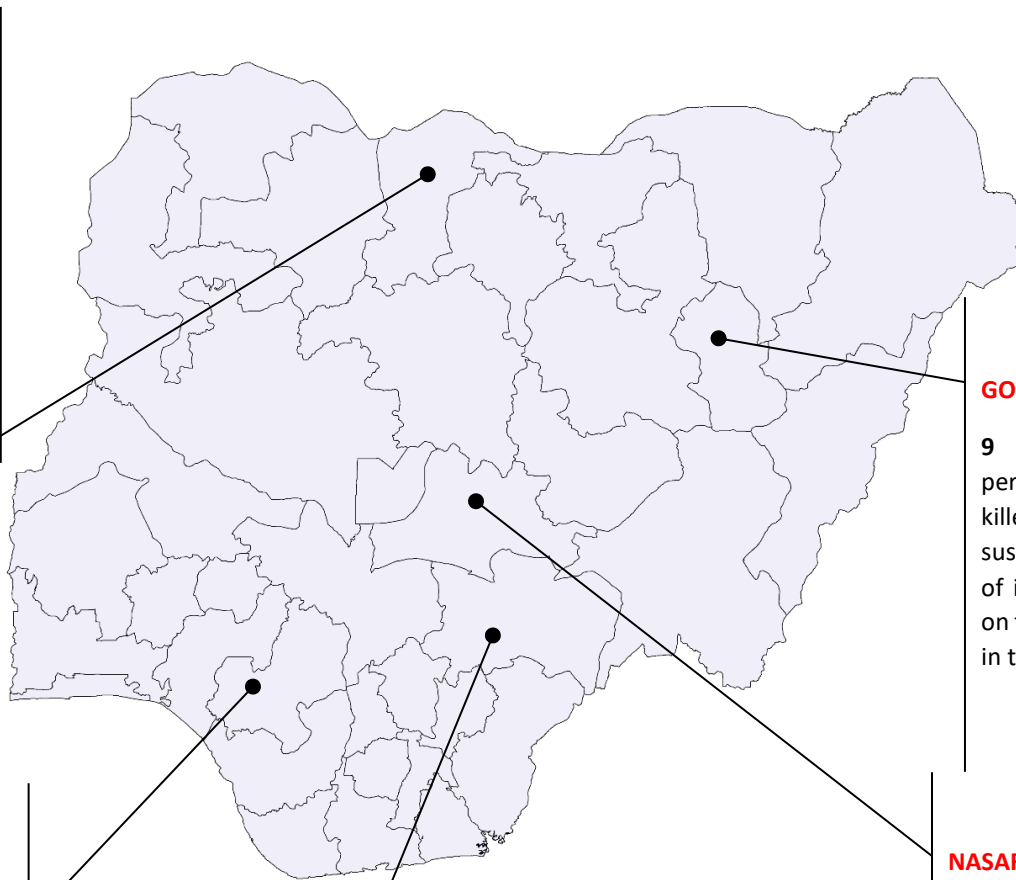

KATSINA

9 NOVEMBER: Armed bandits reportedly attacked the Makera community in Bakori LGA, shooting one person who sustained fatal injuries and seizing six motorcycles.



GOMBE

9 NOVEMBER: Four persons were reportedly killed while 14 children sustained varying degrees of injuries in a lone crash on the Cham–Numan Road in the Balanga LGA.

EDO

9 NOVEMBER: GS Operatives reportedly rescued seven kidnapped victims in Ewohimi, Esan South-East LGA.

BENUE

9 NOVEMBER: Reports gathered that a suspected cultist was killed in the North Bank area of Makurdi.

NASARAWA

9 NOVEMBER: Two youths from the Sarkin Noma community in Keana LGA were reportedly killed during a confrontation with suspected kidnappers who invaded their community.

NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Federal Government Approves Over N1trn For Road Projects Nationwide; Information Credibility- A2

The Federal Government, through the Ministry of Works, has reportedly announced the approval of over N1.04 trillion for road projects nationwide. David Umahi, minister of works, in a statement said that the Federal Executive Council of Nigeria, has in its meeting of 6th November 2025, approved the release of funds for projects including: 163km Sokoto–Badagry Coastal Superhighway Section 3 (Badagry – Ogun-Oyo border) worth N553 billion (N3.39 bn/km, full concrete); Ota–Idiroko Section I at N98 billion & flyover at N23 billion; Ijebu Igbo–Etapá–Owoyen Road 37 km at N53 billion; Lagos–Ibadan Expressway Phase II Section II Fresh award: N43.73 billion includes underpasses, ramps, and side roads; Ilorin–Omu Aran–Egba Road Phase I 31 km at N43 billion among others. The minister explained that improvements in design, rugged terrain, and inflation have led to changes in cost, noting that the cost of reinforcement steel has increased to over N1.1 million per ton.

MARITIME/OIL & GAS DEVELOPMENT

United Kingdom Refined Oil Exports To Nigeria Hit £1.5bn; Information Credibility- A2

Refined oil accounted for more than two-thirds of the United Kingdom's total goods exports to Nigeria in the four quarters ending June 2025, rising sharply to £1.5bn, according to reports. This is according to the latest UK–Nigeria Trade and Investment Factsheet released by the UK Department for Business and Trade. The report, based on data from the Office for National Statistics, showed that refined oil accounted for 68.8 percent of all goods exported from the UK to Nigeria during the period, representing a 62.8 percent increase compared with the four quarters ending in June 2024. Total UK exports to Nigeria increased by 12.3 percent to £5.6 billion. In comparison, imports from Nigeria increased by 8.2 percent to £2.3 billion, bringing total bilateral trade in goods and services between the two countries to £8 billion, up 11.1 percent or £793 million from the previous year.

Crude Earnings Plunge By 43%; Information Credibility- A3

Nigeria's gross profit from crude oil and gas sales plunged by N824.66bn in 2024 despite a rebound in oil production, figures from the latest Budget Implementation Report for the fourth quarter of 2024 released by the Budget Office of the Federation have shown. Data from the report revealed that gross profit from crude and gas sales declined to N1.08 Trillion during the year, from N1.90 trillion in 2023, representing a 43.32 percent decline. The 2024 performance was also 26.3 percent below the government's budgeted target of N1.46 Trillion, underscoring the persistence of weak fiscal inflows from the petroleum sector despite policy reforms aimed at

boosting revenue. The data indicated that the total oil and gas revenue before deductions stood at N15.07 Trillion in 2024, against a budget of N19.99 trillion. This means that actual inflows fell short of the budget by N4.93 Trillion or 24.65 percent.

Nigeria Risks Oil Production Drop Without New Discoveries – NAPE; Information Credibility- A2

The President of the Nigerian Association of Petroleum Explorationists, Johnbosco Uche, has reportedly warned that Nigeria's oil production could decline in the coming years if new exploration efforts and discoveries are not urgently pursued. Speaking at a media parley ahead of the 43rd Annual International Conference and Exhibition of NAPE, scheduled to take place from November 9 to 13, 2025, in Lagos, Uche said that renewed investment in exploration is critical to ensuring long-term energy security and sustainable development. This year's conference is themed "Revitalising the Nigerian Petroleum Exploration and Production Strategies for Energy Security and Sustainable Development." According to him, the theme reflects Nigeria's pressing need to guarantee energy availability, stability, and affordability while preparing the oil and gas industry to remain competitive in a rapidly changing global energy landscape.

CRIME AND TERRORISM

GS Operatives Clash at Checkpoint in Onitsha, Anambra State, Leaving Several Injured; Information Credibility- A2

On November 9, 2025, reports gathered that a violent confrontation erupted at a military checkpoint along Onitsha Road in Onitsha, Anambra State, after Nigerian Army personnel opened fire on police officers returning from election duty. One police officer was shot in the chest, while several others sustained injuries during the confrontation.

Suspected Armed Bandits Kill Two, Burn Farmlands in Katsina State; Information Credibility- A3

On November 9, 2025, armed bandits reportedly attacked the Rawul community in Bakori Local Government Area, Katsina State, killing two persons and setting unharvested farmlands on fire.

Suspected Thugs Invade Benin Museum, Edo State; Information Credibility- A2

On November 9, 2025, suspected thugs reportedly invaded the Museum of West African Art (MOWAA) premises in Benin City, Edo State, disrupting a preview event attended by foreign journalists, diplomats, and tourists. The attackers vandalised parts of the facility and chased away guests while demanding that the museum be renamed the Benin Royal Museum.

POLITICS

ADC Develops Code Of Ethics For 2027 Elections – El-Rufa'i; Information Credibility- A3

Ex-Kaduna State Governor and chieftain of the African Democratic Congress (ADC), Mallam Nasir El-Rufai, says the party is drafting a code of ethics for its leaders and candidates ahead of the 2027 general elections. Speaking to journalists, El-Rufai said the ADC is committed to bringing lasting change to Nigeria. He accused the current administration of President Bola Tinubu of being deceitful, corrupt, and insincere. According to him, the ADC's constitution stands out among political parties in Nigeria because it includes a vision for ethical leadership. "The party's leadership is currently working on a code of ethics that every leader and elected official must sign. It will ensure that those under the ADC focus on good governance, no diversion of public funds, no bribery, and no corruption," he said.

MACROECONOMICS

Capital Gains Tax: Analysts Fear Asset Sell-Off By Investors As FG Focuses On Revenue; Information Credibility- A3

Analysts have suggested that the newly introduced Capital Gains Tax (CGT), which is expected to take effect on January 1, 2026, will negatively impact investments and the country's macroeconomic stability. They said they do not think the policy is a good idea, especially given its implications for venture capital investment, real estate, and other key investments. They also stated that this has led many portfolio investors to consider selling their assets before the end of the year at the existing 10% rate. This is coming at a time when the NGX was in the red as panic-driven sell-offs wiped out roughly N1.8 trillion in market value within just four trading sessions. President Bola Ahmed Tinubu had, in June 2025, assented to the new tax laws, introducing sweeping reforms through the Nigeria Tax Act, 2025. One of the most controversial changes in the new tax system is the increase in the Capital Gains Tax (CGT) rate from 10% to as high as 30%. This policy has generated considerable reactions and takes effect from January 1, 2026.

INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

China Suspends 'Special Port Fees' On US Vessels Amid Trade Truce; Information Credibility- A3

China reportedly announced it would suspend for one year "special port fees" on US vessels, simultaneously with Washington's pause on levies targeting Chinese ships, as a fragile trade truce between the superpowers continues to take shape. The United States and China have been engaged in a volatile trade and tariff war for months, but agreed to ease some punitive measures after Presidents Xi Jinping and Donald Trump met last month in South Korea. At one point, duties on both sides had reached prohibitive triple-digit levels, hampering trade between the world's two largest economies and snarling global supply chains. The suspension of port fees, which

applied to ships operated by or built in the United States that visited Chinese ports, began at 13:01 (05:01 GMT) on Monday, according to a transport ministry statement.

Death Toll In Malaysia Migrant Shipwreck Rises To 13; Information Credibility- A3

According to maritime officials, authorities in Malaysia and Thailand have reportedly recovered at least 13 bodies as they search for survivors after a boat carrying undocumented migrants capsized. Officials said the ship was carrying about 70 migrants, many believed to be from Myanmar's persecuted Rohingya community, trying to reach Malaysia, when it capsized near Thailand's Tarutao island four days ago. They were thought to have been part of a larger group of approximately 300 people, who were divided between at least two boats, police said. Tarutao is just north of Malaysia's island resort of Langkawi, where officials said search-and-rescue operations were being concentrated.

FIRE SAFETY ADVISORY

Following the recent trend in fire outbreaks across the country, there has been a rise in fire outbreaks due to higher temperatures, frequent use of electrical appliances, and dry weather conditions. Clients are urged to remain vigilant by:

- Ensuring all electrical equipment is switched off after use.
- Avoiding overloading of sockets and extension outlets.
- Storing flammable materials safely and away from ignition sources.
- Reporting faulty wiring, appliances, or unusual smells immediately.

FIRE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Electrical Safety

- Do not overload sockets or extension cables.
- Switch off and unplug appliances after use.
- Report damaged wiring or sparking outlets immediately.

Workplace Practices

- Keep corridors, stairways, and exits clear at all times.
- Store flammable materials in designated safe areas.
- Do not smoke in unauthorised areas.

Housekeeping

- Dispose of waste materials properly—avoid paper or debris piling up.
- Keep fire extinguishers and safety equipment accessible.

Emergency Preparedness

- Familiarise yourself with fire exits and evacuation routes.
- Know the location and use of fire extinguishers and alarms.
- Participate in safety drills and training sessions.

Personal Responsibility

- Stay alert for unusual smells (burning wires, gas, smoke).
- Report any unsafe practices immediately.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS & PRECAUTIONS

At Home

- Inspect electrical wiring and appliances regularly; replace faulty or frayed cords.
- Always turn off irons, cookers, and heaters when not in use.
- Keep gas cylinders outside or in a well-ventilated area; check hoses and valves often.
- Store fuel, kerosene, and other flammables safely, away from heat sources.
- Never leave cooking unattended; keep a lid nearby for grease fires.
- Do not smoke indoors or near flammable materials.
- Keep matches and lighters away from children.
- Install and test smoke detectors monthly.
- Keep a fire extinguisher or sand bucket in accessible places.
- Teach family members emergency numbers and escape routes.

At Workplace

- Conduct routine safety inspections on wiring, sockets, and machines.
- Avoid overloading sockets or extension cords.
- Clearly mark and keep fire exits and escape routes unobstructed.
- Ensure fire alarms, extinguishers, and sprinklers are functional.
- Train staff on the PASS method of using extinguishers (Pull, Aim, Squeeze, Sweep).
- Keep flammable materials (paints, fuel, chemicals) in designated storage areas.
- Post “No Smoking” signs where necessary.
- Conduct fire drills at least twice a year.
- Keep first aid kits accessible and stocked.
- Encourage a safety-first culture — every worker is responsible for preventing fire risks.

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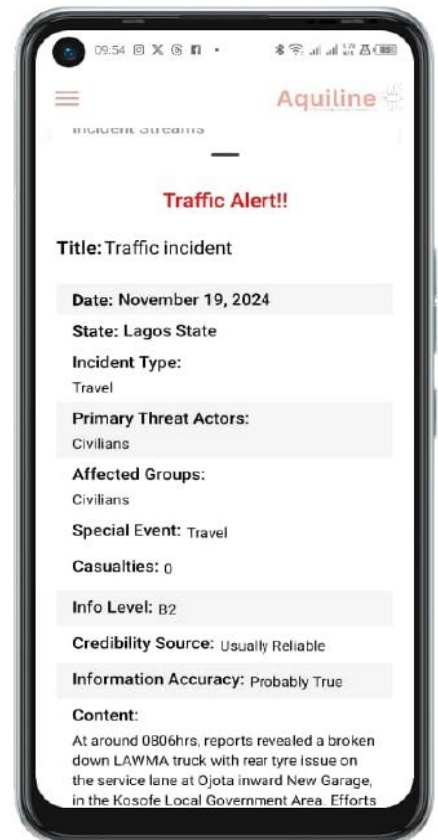
