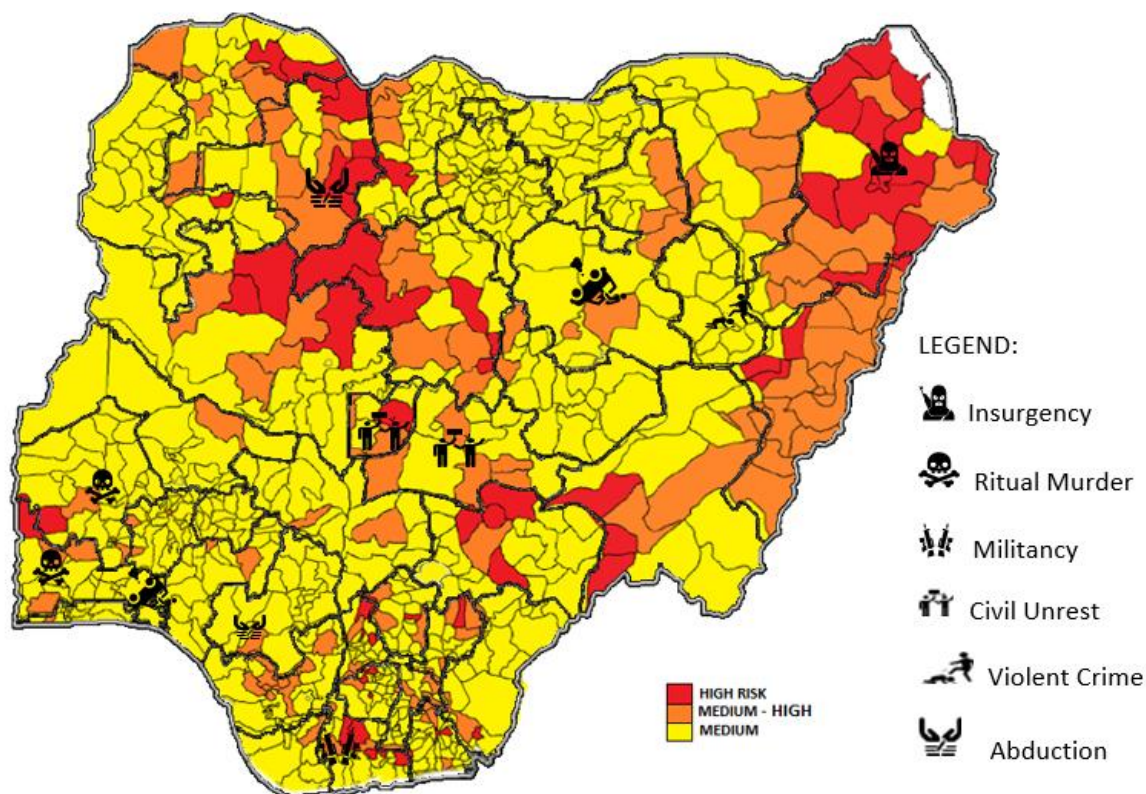

NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

United Kingdom (UK) Launches £12.4m Reforms To Boost Nigeria's Economy; Information Credibility- A2

The United Kingdom has reportedly launched two economic reform programmes worth £12.4m to support Nigeria's macroeconomic stability, fiscal resilience, and private-sector growth. The initiatives, the Nigeria Economic Stability and Transformation programme and the Nigeria Public Finance Facility, were unveiled on Thursday at the British High Commissioner's residence in Abuja. In her opening remarks, the Head of Development Cooperation at the British High Commission, Cynthia Rowe, said the launch marked "an important step in the partnership between the UK and Nigeria". She said the programmes, valued at £12.4m, were designed to strengthen reforms and were aligned with the government's economic priorities. "Together, these programmes signal a coherent and long-term UK commitment to Nigeria's economic trajectory, from stabilisation to reform and to growth," she stated.

MARITIME/OIL & GAS DEVELOPMENT

NNPC Serviced \$3bn Loan With N991bn Crude; Information Credibility- A2

The Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited has serviced part of its \$3bn forward sale loan from the African Export-Import Bank with crude oil worth N991bn in 2024, according to its 2024 financial statement. The repayment was tied to Project Gazelle, a forward crude oil supply agreement signed in 2023. According to reports, on August 17, 2023, the NNPC announced it had secured a \$3.3bn emergency loan from Afreximbank to repay crude oil obligations. It explained that the loan would be used by the oil company to support the Federal Government in stabilising Nigeria's exchange rate. "The NNPC Ltd. and AFREXIM bank have jointly signed a commitment letter and Termsheet for an emergency \$3bn crude oil repayment loan," NNPC said in a statement. "The signing, which took place today at the bank's headquarters in Cairo, Egypt, will provide some immediate disbursement that will enable the NNPC Ltd. to support the Federal Government in its ongoing fiscal and monetary policy reforms aimed at stabilising the exchange rate market," it added. Under the deal, NNPC committed to deliver 90,000 barrels of crude oil per day from Production Sharing Contract assets to back a funding facility. According to the 2023 financial statement, a drawdown of \$2.25bn had already been achieved by 31st December 2023, with principal repayment scheduled to begin in June 2024. The funding carried an interest rate of 3-month LIBOR plus 6.5 per cent, with a 6 per cent margin and 0.5 per cent liquidity premium.

Africa's Upstream Investment Rebounds, Hits \$41bn Forecast; Information Credibility- A2

Africa's oil and gas sector is reportedly set for a fresh wave of investments in 2026, with offshore projects expected to power the continent's projected \$41bn upstream spending, according to

the State of African Energy 2026 Outlook Report released by the African Energy Chamber. The report obtained by our correspondent on Friday showed that Africa's share of global exploration and production expenditure will rise as international and indigenous operators deepen activities across deepwater and ultra-deepwater basins. This comes at a time when global capital spending is forecast to edge up to \$504bn in 2026, slightly above the \$500bn projected for 2025. According to the report, E&P spending in Africa has steadily recovered over the past three years following the crash triggered by the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. The continent is expected to attract \$40bn in 2025, before rising to \$41bn in 2026, signalling a renewed appetite for upstream investment.

Delta Oil-Producing Communities Demand Amenities, Jobs; Information Credibility- A2

Oil-producing communities in the Olero Creek Oil Field, Warri North Local Government Area of Delta State, have threatened to shut down production if the government fails to provide basic amenities and employment opportunities that residents have long demanded. The communities of Ebrohimi, Obaghoro, Tebu, Gbokoda, Aja-Amita, Udo, Jakpa, and several satellite settlements said they could no longer endure decades of neglect, despite their contributions to national crude output. At a joint press conference in Warri on Saturday, their leaders insisted that the demands were "non-negotiable." "These demands are non-negotiable, as they represent the barest minimum of justice and fairness owed to our people," they said. "Our people are already restless and will be ready to do all within their reach to attract the attention of the government at all levels and the world."

Chevron Lauds Security As Oil Production Surges; Information Credibility- A2

The Chairman and Managing Director of Chevron Nigeria/Mid-Africa business unit, Mr Jim Swartz, has disclosed that Chevron recorded zero incidents of sabotage in the past year. Swartz disclosed during his recent visit to the corporate headquarters of the Nigerian Upstream Petroleum Regulatory Commission in Abuja. Chevron has not recorded any oil theft or attacks on our pipelines this year. "This is the longest we've gone without oil theft," Swartz was quoted as saying in a statement. Chevron is a member of the Oil Producers Trade Section, a subgroup of the Lagos Chamber of Commerce and Industry. OPTS is a private industry group dedicated to the exploration, development, and production of Nigeria's oil and gas resources in a sustainable and beneficial manner for the Nigerian people. It represents the interests of approximately 31 oil and gas companies that collectively operate about 85 per cent of Nigeria's oil. The record-breaking success story of Chevron may be linked to the strides recorded by Tantita Security Services Nigeria Limited, a private pipeline security surveillance company owned by High Chief Government Ekpemupolo, widely known as Tompolo.

CRIME AND TERRORISM

Gunmen Attack Afor Market Junction in Anambra State, Kill Several and Injure Many; Information Credibility- A2

On December 7, 2025, suspected gunmen reportedly killed an unconfirmed number of persons while many others were injured during the attack near the Afor Market Junction in Nawfia community, Njikoka Local Government Area of Anambra State.

GS Operatives Arrest Suspected Notorious Bandit in Makurdi, Benue State; Information Credibility- A2

On December 5, 2025, at about 2000 hours, government security operatives in Benue State reportedly arrested a suspected notorious armed bandit at Balcony Park in Makurdi area of Benue State.

POLITICS

We May Join Contractors, Pensioners In Protests Against Govt Over Debts – ADC Warns; Information Credibility- A3

The African Democratic Congress (ADC) has strongly criticised the Federal Government over its mounting debts to local contractors and pensioners, saying the situation is a clear sign of insensitivity to the suffering of ordinary Nigerians. The party made its position known in a statement issued on Sunday and signed by its National Publicity Secretary, Mallam Bolaji Abdullahi. The ADC warned that it is prepared to join the ongoing protests by contractors and pensioners if the government fails to act immediately. The party said it is deeply disturbed by the condition of local contractors who have been camping for weeks at the Federal Ministry of Finance, carrying coffins to symbolise the death of their businesses due to unpaid debts. It added that pensioners, who have threatened to protest naked if their unpaid arrears remain unattended to, are also victims of what the party described as government neglect. “We also stand in strong solidarity with pensioners who are now threatening to march naked in protest if the Federal Government fails to pay what it owes to them in long arrears of pensions.

MACROECONOMICS

Market Gains N2.44tn As ICT, Banking Stocks Drive Surge; Information Credibility- A3

The Nigerian Exchange Limited closed the week on a high, with ICT and banking stocks driving the market up by N2.44 trillion. The All-Share Index gained 2.45 per cent to 147,040.08 points, while market capitalisation rose 2.67 per cent to N93.722tn. Investor activity picked up sharply, with a total turnover of 6.617bn shares worth N113.224bn changing hands in 109,590 deals

during the week, up from 4.140bn shares valued at N115.889bn exchanged in 102,351 deals the previous week. The ICT industry, measured by volume, led market activity with 3.500bn shares valued at N17.759bn traded in 11,184 deals, representing 52.89 per cent of total equity turnover volume and 15.68 per cent of turnover value. The financial services industry was the next most active sector, recording 2.625bn shares worth N50.188bn in 42,574 deals, while the services industry ranked third with 104.524m shares valued at N1.166bn in 7,255 deals. Trading in the three most active stocks—E-Tranzact International Plc, Cornerstone Insurance Plc, and Access Holdings Plc—accounted for 4.871bn shares valued at N27.422bn in 6,438 deals, contributing 73.60 per cent of turnover volume and 24.22 per cent of turnover value.

INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

Thousands Flee Thailand-Cambodia Border After Deadly Clashes And Air Strikes; Information Credibility- A3

Thousands of civilians along the Thailand-Cambodia border are fleeing after an escalation of violence between the two countries. A Thai military spokesman said air force jets bombed Cambodian military positions after a Thai soldier was killed in an exchange of fire along the disputed border. Cambodia has said that four civilians were killed in Thai Army gunfire in its northern border provinces of Preah Vihear and Oddar Meanchey. Clashes have also been reported in Thailand's north-eastern Si Sa Ket and Ubon Ratchathani provinces. Both sides have accused each other of starting the violence, which is the most serious confrontation between the two countries since they agreed to a ceasefire in July.

FIRE SAFETY ADVISORY

Following the recent trend in fire outbreaks across the country, there has been a rise in fire outbreaks due to higher temperatures, frequent use of electrical appliances, and dry weather conditions. Clients are urged to remain vigilant by:

- Ensuring all electrical equipment is switched off after use.
- Avoiding overloading of sockets and extension outlets.
- Storing flammable materials safely and away from ignition sources.
- Reporting faulty wiring, appliances, or unusual smells immediately.

FIRE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Electrical Safety

- Do not overload sockets or extension cables.
- Switch off and unplug appliances after use.
- Report damaged wiring or sparking outlets immediately.

Workplace Practices

- Keep corridors, stairways, and exits clear at all times.
- Store flammable materials in designated safe areas.
- Do not smoke in unauthorised areas.

Housekeeping

- Dispose of waste materials properly—avoid paper or debris piling up.
- Keep fire extinguishers and safety equipment accessible.

Emergency Preparedness

- Familiarise yourself with fire exits and evacuation routes.
- Know the location and use of fire extinguishers and alarms.
- Participate in safety drills and training sessions.

Personal Responsibility

- Stay alert for unusual smells (burning wires, gas, smoke).
- Report any unsafe practices immediately.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS & PRECAUTIONS

At Home

- Inspect electrical wiring and appliances regularly; replace faulty or frayed cords.
- Always turn off irons, cookers, and heaters when not in use.
- Keep gas cylinders outside or in a well-ventilated area; check hoses and valves often.
- Store fuel, kerosene, and other flammables safely, away from heat sources.
- Never leave cooking unattended; keep a lid nearby for grease fires.
- Do not smoke indoors or near flammable materials.
- Keep matches and lighters away from children.
- Install and test smoke detectors monthly.
- Keep a fire extinguisher or sand bucket in accessible places.
- Teach family members emergency numbers and escape routes.

At Workplace

- Conduct routine safety inspections on wiring, sockets, and machines.
- Avoid overloading sockets or extension cords.
- Clearly mark and keep fire exits and escape routes unobstructed.
- Ensure fire alarms, extinguishers, and sprinklers are functional.
- Train staff on the PASS method of using extinguishers (Pull, Aim, Squeeze, Sweep).
- Keep flammable materials (paints, fuel, chemicals) in designated storage areas.
- Post “No Smoking” signs where necessary.
- Conduct fire drills at least twice a year.
- Keep first aid kits accessible and stocked.
- Encourage a safety-first culture — every worker is responsible for preventing fire risks.

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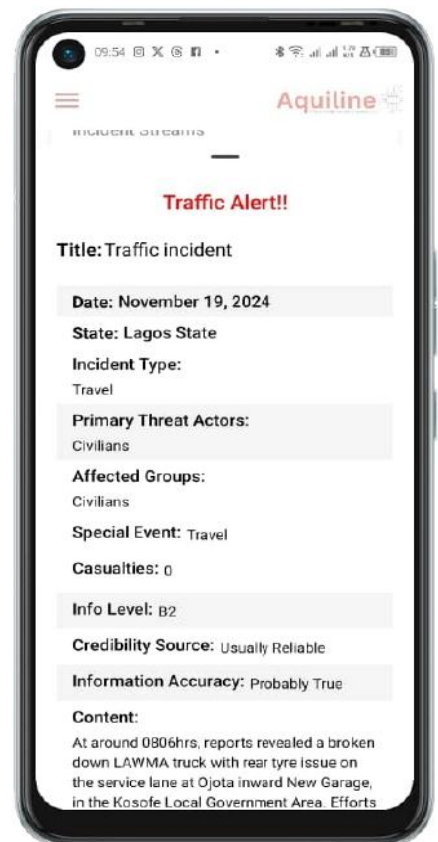
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
